

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
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HAZELNUT PRODUCTION OREGON'S GROWTH


Our industry has experienced 15 years of rapid growth and expansion, with the total acreage nearly tripling in size. Fully mature and producing acreage currently stands around 50-70,000 acres, while about 64,000 new acres have been planted since 2008. Total acreage for the industry now stands at approximately 94,000 acres, while new orchards are still being planted at a slower rate. Some farmers are transitioning from crops like cane berries and grass seed to hazelnuts as the popularity of hazelnuts grows. Older hazelnut orchards susceptible to the Eastern Filbert Blight are being removed at a rate of around 500-1,000 acres per year.

Interesting Fact: Even with this massive growth, Oregon still only accounts for about 5-6% of the world's production of hazelnuts!

HAZELNUT PRODUCTION WORLD MARKETS



Oregon is still a very small part of the world hazelnut industry. Although Oregon hazelnuts make up about 99% of the US hazelnut harvest, we are only 5-6% of the total world production, with Turkey producing nearly 67% (2/3) of the world's hazelnuts. Oregon has become one of the world's top five hazelnut producing regions; the USA moved from fifth to a tie for third largest hazelnut producer in the 2021-2022 season.

Interesting Fact: The 2022 California almond crop is estimated to be 2.8 billion "kernel meat" pounds. Based on current forecasts, that would make Oregon's 2022 record hazelnut crop roughly 2% of the California almond crop in kernel weight.

OREGON HAZELNUT **VARIETIES**

The Oregon State University (OSU) traditional hazelnut breeding effort dates to the 1960s, developed by visionary growers looking to the future. OSU leads the team of breeders and extension scientists who develop new, highly productive, disease-resistance varieties. This guide illustrates the main varieties traditionally grown and currently being planted in the Willamette Valley.

HOW TO CHOOSE NEW PLANTINGS

Before planting a new orchard, one should give serious consideration to varieties, orchard design, orchard site (soil and slope suitability), pre-plant soil management, and other factors. Some varieties are much more sensitive to Eastern Filbert Blight (EFB). See the chart below for a relative spectrum of EFB susceptibility. With new plantings, one should consider mixing in a number of pollen-compatible varieties, with suggestions at the present time leaning toward the new EFB-resistant gene pollinizer varieties released by OSU's Hazelnut Breeding Program, which are Eta, Felix, Gamma, Theta, and York. Here is a list of new varieties with the Gasaway resistance gene and their recommended pollinizers.

HAZELNUT INDUSTRY COMMITS TO OSU

Hazelnut Agronomy Research to Maximize Yields & Quality

ENDOWMENT



Supports Dr. Nik Wiman's Research

For nearly two generations, Oregon hazelnut growers have been focused on developing hazelnut varieties that are resistant to the Eastern Filbert Blight. For simple survival, our industry has invested heavily in the Oregon State University (OSU) Hazelnut Breeding Program and even created an "endowment" to permanently fund the breeding research position.

Now with over 90,000 acres planted, farmers up and down the state are asking more questions about increasing yield and improving quality through agronomy. Such research will increase per acre production and therefore higher per acre returns for growers. With market pressures like we have seen over the past few years, future profitability will rest on expanding "per acre" yields, and reducing defects such as mold, insect damage, and shrivel.

Many experts believe that, with additional research in agronomy, we can increase gross returns per acre by 15-25%. The addition of Dr. Nik Wiman in 2012 as OSU's Orchard Crops Extension Professor has been a huge benefit for our industry.

Nik Wiman earned a BS (biology) and MS (entomology) from Montana State University, where he worked on biological control of weeds in rangeland. From there, he transitioned into tree fruit entomology, working for nearly a decade on mating disruption, biological control, and pest population dynamics in Wenatchee, Washington. He ultimately earned his PhD (entomology) from Washington State University in 2011.

On October 13, 2022, George Packing Company was a signer of an Endowed Fund Gift Agreement with the Oregon State University Foundation to create the HAZELNUT CHAIR AT THE NORTH WILLAMETTE **RESEARCH & EXTENSION CENTER.** The objective is for the hazelnut industry to raise \$2 million in the next 8 years to create a permanent and stable funding source for hazelnut agronomy research. Currently, Nik Wiman's position is subject to state legislative funding, OSU budget allocations, and independent fundraising – none of which lend themselves to long-term planning (which we need for a permanent crop like hazelnuts). This endowment will give long-term funding stability to Nik Wiman and his team's hazelnut agronomy research. 
HARVESTING CLEAN & DRY MEANS HIGHER RETURNS

As a hazelnut grower, you know harvesting in dry weather maintains quality and saves on grower dockage. But did you know it can make you big money? Look closely at cleaning and drying costs — you'll see \$0.05-\$0.10 or more of your field price chiseled away by bringing in wet and dirty hazelnuts.

Most hazelnut processors subsidize the cost of cleaning and drying. However, the more dirt, debris, and moisture (DD&M) the grower brings in, the more the grower pays of the cleaning and drying costs. The Hazelnut Growers Bargaining Association designed its sliding scale to reward growers who maintain their hazelnuts and deliver the high quality that Oregon markets demand.

A grower with 10% DD&M pays just a little over \$0.03/lb., while growers with 40% DD&M pay over 0.10/lb. — that's 3x as much! By harvesting early, you not only save money, but you help boost Oregon hazelnuts' reputation as the highest quality in the world.

THINKING ABOUT OWNING A CLEANER & DRYER?

With the rapid growth in the industry, many growers are asking if we need more cleaners and dryers.

Our answer: Depends on where you are.

The entire hazelnut industry is set up to keep margins low and maximize return to the growers; the receiving station business is the same. This means that you need to be able to source a large volume of hazelnuts from your farm and neighbors to make the cleaning/drying business viable. We estimate that most cleaning and drying facilities will cost \$2-3 million, and the financial break-even point is around 6,000,000 merchantable pounds per year.
